

LANCASTER FELLWALKERS October 28 2018

On Sunday Lancaster Fellwalkers were rewarded with glorious views from the Welsh hills to the Lake District on their walks around Rivington, in cold but clear conditions.

The A+ and A groups started first from Calf Hey Bridge on the A675. David Ward led the A+ group along the Witton Weavers Way, past 3 reservoirs and Turton Tower to Egerton, via Rotary Way and Smithills Moor to Winter Hill, Hordern Stoops and down to Rivington, covering 16 miles and 2000 feet of ascent. John Whitehead took the A group over Great Hill, via Hordern Stops to Winter Hill, down Coalpit Road to Rivington Pike, 13 ½ miles and 1400 feet.

The A- group led by Frank Whittle started in Belmont, following the Witton Weavers Way to Delph Reservoir, then Rotary Way and Scout Road to Burnt Edge, over Two Lads and Brown Hill to Rivington, 10 miles and 1200 feet. Gill Shields took the B group from Rivington up through The Terraces and over Brown Hill to the Pike, skirting Rivington Moor to Old Rachel's and Simms, then down Lead Mine Clough and round Yarrow Reservoir, 8 miles and 1200 feet.
