

FELLWALKERS

Lancaster Fellwalkers enjoyed a gloriously fine day on Sunday, out on the Yorkshire hills around Ingleton.

Mike Codd led the A+ Party over two of the Yorkshire Dales' famous three peaks, first climbing Whernside from Ribbleshead, and then descending to the Hill Inn before climbing to the top of Ingleborough. By the end of the walk at Ingleton, they had covered 13 miles and ascended 3,000 feet. The A party was guided by Mark Scarisbrick on a circular walk from Ingleton, following Oddie's Lane and then climbing up Twistleton Scar End to follow the path above the extensive limestone pavement of Twistleton. The party descended to Chapel-le-Dale and returned along the Roman Road, crossing the River Doe by the stepping stones at Beezleys: 11 miles, 1,400 feet.

The A- Party began their walk in Lancashire, climbing from Ireby over Leck Fell to the summit of Gragareth. Crossing into Yorkshire, Maria Peel led them to Ingleton via Marble Pot and Tow Scar road: 10 miles, 1,800 feet. David Ward and Judith Brown took the B Party from Ribbleshead to Ingleton. They passed by Winterscales Farm and Brunscar Farm, before taking the path above Twistleton Scars and the limestone pavement: 8 miles, 750 feet.
